

## Sports Premium Funding at Buxton School Primary Phase

### Buxton School 2016-2017

#### Sports Premium – Impact Statement

The Sports Premium is government funding of £150 million annually to improve P.E. and sport in primary schools across the country.

The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

Each school will receive £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil each year – Buxton School received £10,872 this academic year. Money should be directed at improving the quality of P.E. teaching within schools, improving provision of extra-curricular P.E. activities and encouraging healthy lifestyles.

#### How are Buxton spending the money?

<b>£3711 – Funding of specialist P.E. staff/coaches.</b>  Specialist P.E. staff have been able to provide a wider range of skilled focussed PE activities from Reception to Year 6.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Consistent quality teaching of P.E. from trained specialists.</li><li>- Progression of skills across the Primary Phase Reception –Year 6.</li><li>- A changing rota of after school clubs so children can try out a range of different sports offered by sports specialists and additional school staff who have been supported by the specialist.</li><li>- Disadvantaged pupils in each year group have been targeted and encouraged to attend those clubs that have been designed to meet a specific need e.g. obesity, lack of interest in sports, health and fitness. Pupils have been able to take part in a wider range of sports fixtures and competitions e.g. Tag Rugby, Hockey, Athletics, Table Tennis, Tennis, Football, Basketball, Netball.</li></ul>
<b>£2000 – New equipment</b>  This has included netballs and basketballs, table tennis equipment, cricket equipment, shin pads, mouth guards, skipping ropes, tag rugby belts, balance benches and playground balls.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- New equipment has meant that children have been able to play a wider range of games and access a wide.</li><li>- Extra equipment has meant intra-school competitions can be run with all year groups.</li><li>- Classes can now use equipment simultaneously.</li></ul>

<p><b>£2000 – Providing out of hours sports clubs.</b></p>	<p>- These clubs have been targeted towards those children who are the least able and least engaged. The aim is to provide them with an opportunity to try out different sports, to build skills and confidence and to instil a love of sport and healthy living.</p>
<p><b>£1200 - Sports Federation subscription</b></p> <p>This subscription allows the school entry into competitions across the borough.</p>	<p>- A chance for many children to take part in competitive sport, playing against other children their age.</p> <p>- Children learn how to represent the school in a positive manner, with sportsmanlike behaviour.</p> <p>- Building skills such as teamwork and communication.</p>
<p><b>£500 Inspirational Sports Trips</b></p>	<p>Taekwondo ,Wheel chair, Tennis, Hockey, Para Athletics,</p>
<p><b>£500 Competitions</b></p>	<p>This has targeted all ranges of ability: PP, SEND and Most Able the Sports Premium has enabled us to transport pupils with no cost passed on to pupils. Pupils who have required resources e.g. kits and any other specific related equipment.</p>
<p><b>£1,000 Training for PE Lead to lead on a variety of initiatives</b></p>	<p>This has resulted in new initiatives : Daily Mile, Active 60, Anti Sedentry Life Styles, Assemblies on Healthy Living linked with Science Coordinator</p>
