Curriculum

Over the next half term we will be covering the following:

Literacy - Explanatory texts, poetry, fiction, story-writing.

Numeracy - Reading, writing and recognising numbers to 100; addition and subtraction within 100.

Science - 'Materials' and 'Forces'

ICT - Using code.

Art & DT - Investigation materials, printing and painting, exploring different textures, collage and construction.

PSHE (Planet You) - Relationships

R.E. - Judaism

P.E. - Dance, gymnastics and ball games.

Reading!

Last term your child received login details for **Bug Club** (Online Reading Resource). Books have been allocated for your child. Please ensure your child has an opportunity to access this resource and read the books that have been assigned for them.

Reading books will continue to be changed every week. Please ensure your child continues to read regularly at home. The reading record booklet should be returned everyday. Please ensure you look after the reading books and you return them in good condition.

Our Targets

Reading–

To use phonetic knowledge as a prime approach to reading.

To be able to use phonetic knowledge to read real and nonsense words.

To be able to answer comprehension questions based on the text.

Writing-

To write sentences using capital letters, full stops and finger spaces.

To use phonics sounds to spell unfamiliar words.

To use adjectives and connectives in sentences.

To be able to use a wide range of punctuation including commas, question marks, exclamation marks and speech marks.

To begin to write in paragraphs.

Maths-

To recognise, count, order, write and use numbers up to 100.

To solve addition and subtraction equations within 100.

To identify the place value of numbers to 100.

To begin to use mental calculation strategies.

To be able to solve word problems.

Behaviour Policy

At Buxton School, we have very high expectations for children's behaviour. As you are aware, we operate a behaviour management called Good to be Green. Children who display inappropriate behaviour are given a warning and then moved from green to yellow. If they continue to misbehave, they go to orange and finally red. This half term the children who manage to behave well consistently will be rewarded with a treat. In order to encourage good behaviour, children who receive 3 points will miss their treat. Red= 1 point and Orange= 0.5 points Therefore, if they receive 3 reds (3 points) or 6 oranges (3points) or a combination that adds up to 3 points the child will miss their treat. We will keep you informed if your child is on orange or red and we hope that both the teachers and parents can work together to ensure good behaviour from all children.
