Buxton All Through Attendance

In the UK it is a legal requirement that all children of compulsory school age attend school daily as failure to do this may result in a Fixed Penalty Notice (which is a fine under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996 where a parent fails to ensure that their child attends school regularly) being issued. A Fixed Penalty Notice fine starts at £60 per parent per child and will increase after 28 days if payment has not been received to £120 per parent per child. Ultimately, parents can be prosecuted in court for their child's nonattendance at school. Buxton School continues to monitor attendance actively and, as such, we have asked the Borough to issue Fixed Penalty Notices to parents who have chosen not to send their child to school for a variety of reasons, ie, unauthorised holidays or unauthorised absences. Please be reminded that if your child is absent, it is your responsibility as the parent/ carer to inform the school on the same day and each day of absence unless informed otherwise. We will require medical evidence where your child has been absent for three (3) or more consecutive days.
