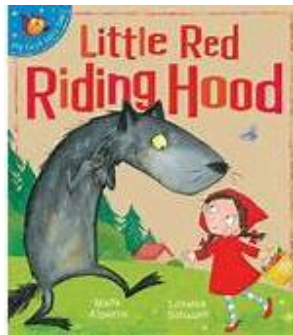

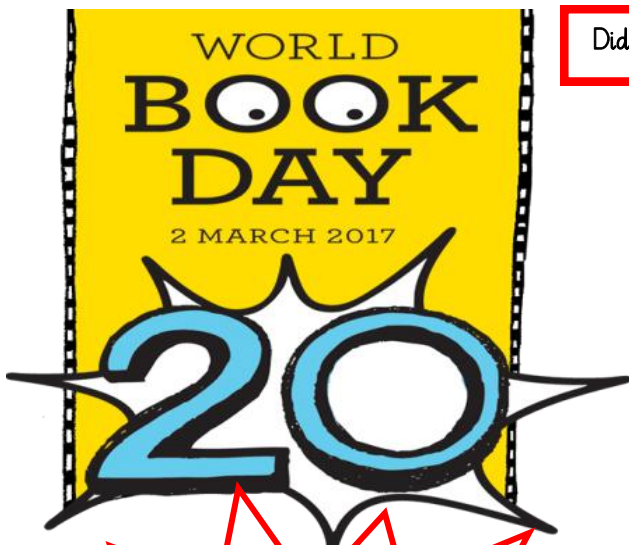
Mathematician of the Week
